\rightarrow NEW STUDIES IN ART WITHIN ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTERS

The degree programme is addressed to candidates whose artistic creativity is not limited to contemporary professions but may go beyond the all-known limits of the arts in terms of creating audio-visual content. The Erasmus Mundus programme provides a monthly scholarship of €1,400 throughout the entire course of studies for an average of 75% of students. The two-year degree programme covering a total of 120 ECTS credits will be implemented at the following partner institutes: Jean Monnet University, Universidade Católica Portuguesa, and the University of Silesia. \rightarrow ECOLOGY AND SUSTAINABILITY OF GLOBAL CHANGES WITHIN ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTERS

The 15-month project is to design a joint Master's degree programme in protection and management to be offered by a consortium formed by three universities of the Transform4Europe Alliance: the University of Silesia (the project leader), the University of Trieste, and Vytautas Magnus University. The <u>first Bootcamp organised by T4EU</u> was officially launched on 10 September 2024 in the city of Burgas. The initiative was part of the T4EU Transformation Laboratory aimed at engaging young researchers and graduate students in the Alliance's outreach, stimulating interdisciplinary research, and fostering cooperation with key stakeholders.

\rightarrow T4EU AT EAIE 2024 IN TOULOUSE

The <u>34th Annual European Association for International Education EAIE</u> <u>conference</u>, held in Toulouse, France, from 17 to 20 September 2024, featured T4EU representatives. They hosted an individual booth to welcome partners and interested parties to discuss plans and possible cooperation, and participated in various sessions, roundtables, and panels covering such topics as academic international engagement and the vital role of European Universities.

\rightarrow STAFF WEEK: MODERNIZING UNIVERSITIES WITHIN THE T4EU FRAMEWORK

Jean Monnet University organised its very first <u>staff week event</u> dedicated to managing directors, deans, and senior administrator from T4EU universities. Together, they worked and exchange knowledge on such topics as: challenging our organisations regarding the European scale, organisational innovation: innovative structural models in higher education, and how to strengthen inter-departmental collaborations.

The workshop included numerous events open to the public: open lectures and a film screening at the Narva Art Residency, an open lecture at the Sillamäe Cultural Center, and presentations of students group work projects at the Estonian Academy of Arts. \rightarrow BEYOND BOUNDARIES: VMU NURTURES INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING IN T4EU SUMMER SCHOOL

T4EU has recently concluded a successful <u>three-day summer school</u>, the (Co)happiness Lab, organised by Vytautas Magnus University from 27 to 29 August. The programme attracted 21 students representing nine partner universities, fostering a rich intercultural environment that allowed participants to experience diverse cultures and gain valuable skills in navigating interdisciplinary and intercultural programs.

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\rightarrow T4ERI NATIONAL POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS





Between 2021 and 2023, the T4ERI team launched a series of research-informed activities and initiatives, examining the staff of what were then seven, and now ten, universities within the Alliance. The results of these activities, conducted under Work Package 3, entitled 'The Best Careers for the Brightest Minds', resulted in recommendations for diversifying and increasing the flexibility of standards for scientific careers.
